



Mr. Arthur Kenneth Steinberg

December 30, 1937 - June 10, 2013

Mr. Arthur Kenneth Steinberg, 75, of Salisbury, NC passed away Monday, June 10, 2013 at Northeast Medical Center.

Born December, 30, 1937 in Chicago, IL Arthur was the son of the late Florence Chepov Steinberg and Fredrick Burton Steinberg.

Mr. Steinberg attended DePaul University, Roosevelt University, Kent State University and earned his Ph.D. in Russian history. He also received Juris Doctorate from John Marshall Law School in Atlanta and was a member of Sigma Delta Kappa. He taught at several colleges and universities, 8 years at Livingstone College and 15 years at Catawba College with the Evening Undergraduate Program. Mr. Steinberg practiced law in Atlanta for 20 years and was a dual-national Israeli lawyer for the Ministry of Justice in Jerusalem in the 1980's. He also served of the Zoning Board of Appeals for 6 years and was chairman for 4 years.

Mr. Steinberg was a member of the Optimist, receiving several acknowledgements such as Rookie of the Year, Optimist of the Year 2002-2003, President 2002-2003. He was a member of the Andrew Jackson Masonic Lodge, a 32nd degree Mason and Scottish Rite, he was also on the Zoning Board of Appeals for six years and Chairman for four of those year, and a member of Temple Israel. He was of Judaic faith.

Those left to cherish his memory are his wife Jane Grogan Smith-Steinberg, stepson, Robert Evans Smith and wife Susan; stepdaughters, Kathleen Louise Smith, Janine Smith-Wicklund and husband Robert; 5 step-grandchildren and one step-great-grandchild.

Funeral service will be held at 4 PM Sunday, June 16, 2013 at the Masonic Lodge on N. Fulton St., Salisbury, NC with Rabbi Andrew Ettin officiating. Visitation will be held after the service in the Masonic Lodge.
