Mr. Billy Floyd Pless, Sr., 81, of Spencer, passed away Wednesday, March 17, 2010 at Rowan Regional Medical Center.

Born December 2, 1928, he was the son of the late Floyd Pless and Sadie Cruse Pless. He was educated in the Rowan County schools.

Mr. Pless was employed with Rowan Dairy which later became Flavor Rich from 1952-1996. He was also one of the first original charter members of the Rowan County Rescue Squad.

He was a member of the Knights of Pythis and also Green Mountain Camping Resort and the Tar Heel Squares.

Mr. Pless is preceded in death by his parents; a sister, Alice Brown; and his wife, Peggy Miller Pless, whom he married on June 2, 1951. She passed away on December 23, 1998.
