Cleveland Eugene "Gene" Campbell, Jr., 72, of Granite Quarry died Saturday, March 12, 2011 at Wake Forest University Baptist Medical Center, Winston-Salem.

Born December 17, 1938 in Burlington, he was the son of the late Cleveland Eugene "Cleve" Campbell, Sr. and Ruth Walters Campbell.

Mr. Campbell graduated from Boyden High School and the University of Maryland.

He was a veteran of the US Army's ASA. After serving in the military, he served with the Department of Defense and retired from the Veterans Administration's Winston-Salem Regional Office.

He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Salisbury where he was baptized, a member of the Summa Pretende Sunday School Class where he served as Treasurer, served as a Trustee and was a member of the DAV.
