



Clifford "Tip" Mitchell McCachren

April 15, 1934 - November 21, 2024

Clifford "Tip" Mitchell McCachren, 90, of Virginia, passed away Thursday, November 21, 2024 at Anchored in Peace Living Home.

Tip was born April 15, 1934 in Harrisburg, NC to the late Bernice Nash McCachren and Hoyt McKee McCachren. He was a graduate of NC State University majoring in Agriculture. Tip worked for the US Government Dept. of Agriculture as a Soil Scientist. He mapped and surveyed most of North Carolina.

Tip was a member of Evergreen Community Presbyterian Church of Powhatan, VA and First Presbyterian Church of Salisbury. He was also a member of the Civitan Club, Kiwanis, Lions Club, and a Boy Scout Leader. He had earned his Eagle Scout. Tip was a tour guide for the Historical Salisbury Foundation and volunteered with the Transportation Museum of Spencer. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy Mae McCachren who passed away April 4, 2021; and his sister Eugenia Holste who passed away August 18, 2024.

Surviving is his son, Shane McCachren and wife Stephanie of Powhatan, VA; brothers, Hoyt McCachren of Salisbury, NC, Billy McCachren and wife Nancy of Dobson, NC; and three grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held at Summersett Memorial Chapel in Salisbury, NC at Noon on Saturday, December 14, 2024; officiated by Nick Krauss.

Burial will take place at Garrett Hillcrest Memorial Park in Waynesville, NC.
