



Clyde Daniel Bond

January 11, 1921 - November 16, 2011

Mr. Clyde Daniel Bond, 90, of Salisbury, NC passed away peacefully at the Lutheran Home at Trinity Oaks on Wednesday, November 16, 2011.

Born in Cleveland, Ohio on January 11, 1921, Clyde was the son of the late Floyd Daniel Bond and Margaret Leidenfust Bond.

Clyde grew up on a 25 acre farm that his father purchased during the depression. Along with his sister, Gloria, and his brother, Jack, Clyde worked the farm with horses and provided vegetables for the family.

He attended East Claridon Elementary School and graduated from Huntsburg High School in 1938. He joined the Army/Air Corp in 1942 and was discharged January 3, 1946. He received the Good Conduct Medal, Distinguished Unit Badge and Service Medal with three Bronze Stars.

After being discharged from the military, Clyde worked in the printing industry for many years and retired from Schneider National.

Clyde was a member of Stallings Memorial Baptist Church having been a Sunday School Teacher and was Past-President of the Homeowner's Association at Wellington Hills.

Clyde was predeceased by his wife, Brenda Peeler Bond, on January 17, 2011, and is survived by his three children, daughters, Dayle and Faith of Ohio and son, Dan of Lincolnton, NC; sister, Gloria Van Dixon of Ohio; sisters-in-law, Jean Bond of Pennsylvania; Arlene Taylor of Rockwell, NC and Marlene Spencer of Salisbury, NC; brother-in-law, James C. Peeler, Jr of Salisbury; and a number of nieces and nephews.

A visitation will be held from 10-11:00 AM Saturday (Nov. 19) at Summersett Funeral Home.

A Service of Celebration and Remembrance will be conducted at Summersett Memorial Chapel on Saturday (Nov. 19) at 11:00 AM; conducted by Rev. Charlie Bryan. Burial will follow at Chestnut Hill Cemetery.
