Mrs. Doris Jean Eller Webb, 91, of Salisbury, passed away Thursday, December 9, 2021 at Novant Health Rowan Medical Center.

Born September 1, 1930 in Rowan County, Jean was the daughter of the late John Louis Eller and Grace Owen Eller. She was a 1948 graduate of China Grove High School and received an Associate's Degree from Pfeiffer College. She was previously employed as a Secretary at Rowan Mills and, later, as a teacher's assistant and bus driver for Rowan County Schools.
