Dorothy “Dot” Ragan Jones, 93, of Salisbury (formally of Greensboro, NC), passed away on Wednesday, November 11, 2020 at The Laurels of Salisbury. Born February 12, 1927 in Granville County she was the daughter of the late William Samuel Ragan and Emma Claire Long Ragan. She received her education in Fuquay Varina, NC. She was employed as a bookkeeper for many years at Cooks (Clarks) Department Store in Greensboro and later retired from McKnight Hardware in Greensboro at the age of 79.

She was an avid reader, especially of the Bible and Danielle Steele novels. She was a devoted Christian and loved her Lord.
