



Eleanor Louise Weir Johnson

January 20, 1920 - July 12, 2017

Eleanor Louise Weir Johnson, 97, of Salisbury, NC passed away Wednesday, July 12, 2017 at The Lutheran Home at Trinity Oaks.

She was born January 20, 1920 in Columbia, SC to the late Jessie May Hedgepath Weir and Charles David Weir and graduate from Columbia High School in 1937. She attended Draughon Business College. Mrs. Johnson worked for the U.S. Treasury Dept. State Procurement Office.

Mrs. Johnson worked at CMC – Northeast as a volunteer for 15 years. She also served on Cooperative Christian Ministries for 15 years.

Mrs. Johnson was a member of Kimball Memorial Lutheran Church for 41 years before moving to Salisbury and transferring her membership to St. John's Lutheran Church in 2001. While at Kimball Lutheran Church she taught Sunday School, Bible School, Week-day Church School, was a Cub Scout Den Mother for 10 years, Circle Chairman for a number of years, President of the W.C.L.C.A. for two terms, and served on many church committees. She also was a Southern Seminary Auxiliary Life Member and a teacher for a literary program for several years.

She was preceded in death by her husband Rev. David Frontis Johnson on August 6, 1981 and her sister, Anna Margaret Weir Campbell.

Surviving are her two sons, James David Johnson of Raleigh, NC and John Foster Johnson and his wife Sali of Boone, NC and one grandson, Ian Cassidy Johnson.

The family will receive friends at 1:30 PM Friday (July 14) at St. John's

Lutheran Church. The funeral service will follow at 2 PM in the Chapel of St. John's Lutheran Church , officiated by Rev. Danielle DeNise . Burial will follow the service at Carolina Memorial Park, Concord, NC.
