Everette William Lowman, 83 of Salisbury died Wednesday, December 16, 2009 at the Laurels of Salisbury.

Born December 8, 1926 in Alleghany County, NC, he was the son of the late Jerome and Esther Gentry Lowman. He was educated and graduated from East Spencer School. He was a Seaman 2nd Class in the US Navy during World War II and served in the Coast Guard Auxiliary until his health failed him.
