December 2, 1946 - May 9, 2019

Frank Grady Hall, III, 72 of Salisbury, NC passed away Thursday, May 9th at The Laurels of Salisbury.

He was born December 2, 1946 in Rowan County, NC to the late Evelyn Frank Hall Wuamett and Frank Grady Hall, Jr. He was a graduate of West Rowan High School Class of 1965, earned his Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Western Carolina University, and his Master's Degree in Guidance and Counseling from UNC-Charlotte.

Mr. Hall retired from the State of NC Vocational Rehabilitation as Unit Director of three counties after working 40 years.

He was a proud Democrat, a member of Christ Episcopal Church, Past Master of the Scotch Irish and Andrew Jackson Masonic Lodges, past NC State President of the Sons of the American Revolution, a member of the Sons of the Confederate Veterans, First Families of Maryland, Military Order of Stars & Bars, and the Order of Founders & Patriots.

Surviving is his wife, Trudy Curran Hall whom he married December 15, 1968; daughters Julie Hall Hunter of Salisbury, NC; Melissa Hall Hill (Todd Hill) of Pittsboro, NC; Elizabeth Curran Hall (Maria De La Cruz) of Grand Prairie, TX; sisters, Anne Hall O'Hart of Ocala, FL; Judy Hall Baratela of Gibsonville, NC; and Patti Hall Redden (Tom Redden) of Cleveland, NC.

Also surviving are his grandchildren: MacKenzie Hunter, Kirkland Hunter, Emma Grace Hill, Blair Hill, Corina De La Cruz, Marybeth De La Cruz and great-granddaughter, Brielle Hunter.

The funeral service will be held at 2 pm Monday, (May 13), at Christ Episcopal Church in Cleveland, NC. Burial will follow at Christ Episcopal Church Cemetery. There will be a visitation with the family in the Parish Hall at the church after the burial.
