



## Frank J. Earnheart

June 14, 1924 - July 3, 2012

Frank J. Earnheart, 88, of Thomasville passed away July 3, 2012 at Piedmont Crossing Retirement Center.

He was born June 14, 1924 in Salisbury to the late Fannie F. Jones and Hilbert F. Earnheart.

Mr. Earnheart was educated in Rowan County Schools, and graduated with a degree in Chemistry from UNC Chapel Hill. He studied law first at Duke Law School and graduated from George Washington University Law School. He served his country three years in the U.S. Navy during WW II, and became commanding officer of a mine-sweeper on duty in the rivers and harbors of China and the South Pacific.

He retired in 1989 as Vice President, Secretary and General Counsel of Selas Corp. of America in Pennsylvania, where he was a member of American Legion and Navy League of U.S.

Those left to cherish his memory include a daughter Laurie (and husband Richard) Williamson of Connecticut, three grandchildren, an older sister Arietta of North Carolina, and numerous nieces and nephews.

A memorial service will be held 4 pm, Saturday, July 7, at Grace Lutheran

Church, 115 Unity Street, Thomasville, NC, with the Rev. Mike Hoffmann officiating. Visitation with family members will be held 3:45 pm before the service at the church. A military graveside burial service will be held 12 noon, Monday, July 9, at Salisbury National Cemetery, with the Rev. David Nelson officiating.
