



Harold Raney "Hal" Womble

June 12, 1928 - October 29, 2011

Harold Raney "Hal" Womble, 83, of Salisbury died Saturday, October 29, 2011 at his home.

Born June 12, 1928 in Salisbury, he was the son of the late Agnes Rainey Womble and Guy H. Womble, Sr. He was educated in the Salisbury schools, attended Boyden High School and graduated from East Spencer High School in 1948.

Mr. Womble was a veteran of the US Army during the Korean War, he served in the 101st AB Infantry Training Division, Ft. Jackson, SC.

Mr. Womble was employed by Southern Railway from 1948-53, McLean Trucking Co. 1953-57, American Tobacco Co. 1957-63 and C. F. Sauer Co. 1963-91 when he retired. Following retirement he worked part-time for PIA & Crossmark and did resets for Food Lion and Winn Dixie from 1991-2007.

He was a member of Stallings Memorial Baptist Church for over 50 years, he was an active member of the Harold B. Jarrett American Legion Post #342 and was a former member of the Salisbury Moose Club, Rowan Civitan Club. He was an avid golfer and sports fan.

In addition to his parents, his wife, Lois Bowers Womble whom he married

Nov. 1, 1950, preceded him in death on May 18, 2000; and infant daughter, Linda D. Womble; brothers, Guy H. Womble, Jr., Donald R. Womble; sisters, Frances W. Ballard and Doris W. Heffner.

Those left to cherish his memory are his sons, Kenneth W. Womble of Salisbury, Kevin L. Womble and wife Kim of Rockwell; granddaughters, Heather M. Womble of Atlanta and Kellie Womble of Rockwell; grandson, Kyle Womble of Rockwell; 11 nieces and nephews.
