



## Homer Gibson Hall

November 22, 1924 - April 28, 2012

Homer Gibson Hall passed away early Saturday morning, April 28, 2012 at his home in the Trinity Oaks Lutheran Retirement Community in Salisbury, NC at the age of 87.

Mr. Hall was born on November 22, 1924 in Franklin Township, Rowan County, NC and is survived by his wife of 64 years, Laura Brinkley Hall, and his three children, Jeannette H. Reid of Clemmons, Robert N. Hall and wife Deborah W. Hall of Kernersville, and Laura Ann Hall of Durham. He is also survived by his nephew, Barre R. Mitchell and wife Gilda W. Mitchell of Rock Hill, SC, his great niece Margo C. Mitchell, his niece, Brenda M. Stuckey and husband Howard Stuckey of Jonesboro, LA, and great nephew Shane Holder. Mr. Hall was raised on his family's farm in Rowan County, graduated from Cleveland High School, worked as a welder in the Wilmington, NC naval shipyard, and enlisted in the US Air Force after turning eighteen to join the WWII war effort, becoming a certified fighter pilot. After the war Mr. Hall graduated from NC State University in Raleigh and spent his working career in the textile industry primarily at Firestone Textiles in Gastonia, NC. The family spent three years in Brazil during the early 1960's when Mr. Hall was on assignment in Sao Paulo for Firestone as plant manager. Mr. Hall was an active member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, the Kiwanis Club, and the Elks Lodge in Gastonia, NC. He will be remembered for his great kindness toward everyone, his robustness, fortitude and self reliance, his engaging smile and as a loving, devoted father, husband and provider. A life-long learner with

strong work ethic and moral fiber, Homer Hall was a shining example of the Greatest Generation.

Memorial services will be held at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Gastonia, NC, 258 W Franklin Blvd on Saturday, May 5, 2012 at 3:00PM, and at Trinity Oaks Lutheran Retirement Community in Salisbury, NC, 728 Klumac Road, on Monday, May 7, 2012 at 3:00PM. Graveside services for the family will follow at St. Matthews Episcopal Church in Salisbury, 4401 Statesville Blvd.

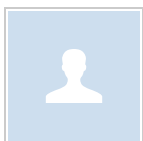
