



## Jane Blalock Gill

June 15, 1922 - May 1, 2012

Jane Blalock Gill, 89, of Salisbury, NC died on Tuesday, May 01, 2012 at The Lutheran Home at Trinity Oaks.

She was the daughter of the late Ruth and Tom C. Blalock, born on June 15, 1922 in Norwood, NC. She received her education at Boyden High School and Catawba College, graduating in 1943. Additional credits were earned at Appalachian College and Duke University. She was a teacher, having taught a total of forty-one years in various schools including time in Lexington at Robbins Elementary School, in Salisbury at Wiley, in Accomack County, Virginia at Bloxom and completing her career in Rowan County at Mt. Ulla. Mrs. Gill was a member of Second Presbyterian Church where she served as a Sunday School and Bible School teacher. She also served as a Deacon, Elder and Clerk of Session for many years.

She is survived by her daughter, Cindy Gill Hogan and her husband Steve of Virginia Beach, Virginia along with their children Stephen and Ruth and by her son Robert B. Gill and his wife Cheryl of Travelers Rest, South Carolina and their son Matthew Bennett and his wife Marie-Louise.
