in the late 90's, I was a recently transplanted 22 year old living in a small town suburb North of Charlotte North Carolina and working as an inside sales rep for Southern Alloy. I didn't know a soul in town and was as so poor I couldn't pay attention. Jeane was the sales secretary, her son Shane (who recently past away) was a fellow salesmen, and Sherman was the warehouse manager.

I was very unsure of myself, surrounded by and speaking to strange sounding folks (my northern hearing had not yet adjusted to southern twang), and missing home. Jeanie always had an encouraging word, and the Wilson's always made sure I had Sunday Supper in my belly. I was invited to watch sporting events at their home and they treated me like family .

Many young men came up through the ranks of Southern Alloy, and many of them became very successful. We all, had one common thread, Miss Wilson as our mother hen.

Years later, I had the opportunity to bring both her and Sherman over to the Williams Metals Carolina location. It was a privilege and a joy to work with them both again as i spent a great deal of time at the Carolina branch. Both would chastise me for working late and not taking any time for myself. All those years later Jeanie would make sure I would eat properly.

I have had the fortune of having many people in my life, some great, some very forgettable, some down right painful. There was no more positive influence than Miss Jeane Wilson. Her kind words and at times a kick to the backside as only a demur southern gal could were always heartfelt. Jeanie you will be missed and the world was a better place while you were in it.
