Mr. John William (Bill) Ward, 75, passed away on Saturday evening, January 9, 2010 at Rowan Regional Medical Center in Salisbury.

Bill was born in Galax, VA and from the time he entered National Business College in 1951, he was meant to be in the furniture business. His career began at Johnson Carper Furniture Company in Roanoke, VA, where in 1965 he became the General Manager after the company was acquired by Singer Furniture. In 1974, he was transferred to Atlanta, Georgia, as the Vice-President of Sales for Singer Furniture at its corporate offices. After leaving Singer, he continued in the furniture industry, serving for a time as a board member of the American Furniture Manufacturers' Association. For the past 18 years, he served as President of Carter Furniture Company in Salisbury, NC. He cherished the friends and neighbors he had in Salisbury and considered them a part of his family. Bill was a gregarious story teller, a loyal friend and a loving family man.

He is predeceased by his father and mother, Mr. Emmette and Cecil Ward, and one sister, Rowena Manning.
