Joseph B. Krochmal, 93, of Salisbury passed away Wednesday, November 7, 2018.

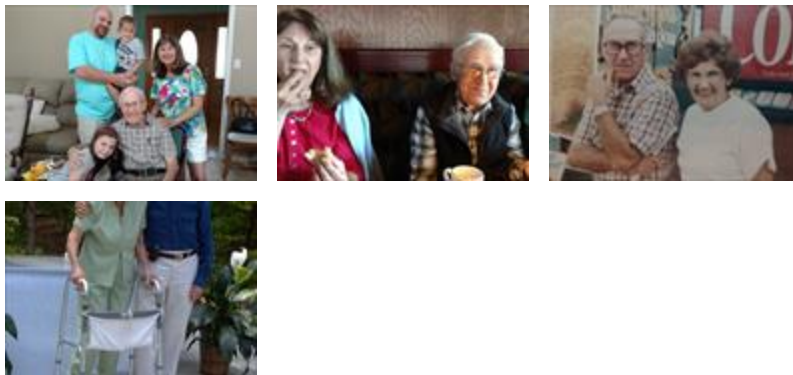

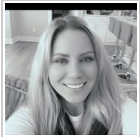

“ My mother Genevieve was one of 10 children; there were 8 girls and 2 boys in their family.

*Mother's younger brother Joe, my dear Uncle Joe, was born March 30, 1925.*

*I was born July 1, 1939 – so he was 14 years older than I was. He lived in the front house on Professor with his parents, and my parents lived in the back house, so we got to see each other quite a bit during my young years.*

*My family moved to Geneva in August 1942, the month after I turned 3.*

*Uncle Joe enlisted in the US Navy after his 18th birthday in 1943 (USS Langley 1943-1946). so I'm guessing this incident happened the summer of 1942 either right before or right after my 3rd birthday.*

*About a year ago Uncle Joe and I were talking on the phone, memories of Professor Avenue in Cleveland. He said he remembered walking down the sidewalk with me one day, when I was “just a tot.”*

*We were not holding hands. He walked next to the street, of course, as gentlemen did at that time. For a while he had his hands in the pockets of his pants; he said they were something like the cargo-pants of today. He said at one point I looked up at him, and observed that his hands were deep in his pockets. Since I didn't have any pockets in my dress, I reached across and put my little hand and arm deep into the lower pocket on HIS pants, and we continued our stroll.*

*I am so glad that he remembered that snippet of time from long and and shared it with me; I have thought of it often since then. Uncle Joe was always very special to me, loving and laughing, positive and upbeat. I loved him a lot. Monica Ols*
