Joseph Amin Saleeby, 94, of Salisbury passed away Sunday, August 18, 2013 at the Lutheran Home at Trinity Oaks.

Born June 9, 1919 in Brooklyn, NY, he was the son of the late Naseema Saleeby and Amin Joseph Saleeby.

Mr. Saleeby was educated in the Brooklyn, NY schools and attended Catawba College, North Carolina State University and the RCA Bell Laboratories, in New York
