Salisbury Kerr Julian Krider died Saturday morning at Rowan Regional Medical Center. He was born July 28, 1914 in Salisbury, NC., the son of the late James Hodge and Hallie Julian Krider. He graduated from Boyden High School and Catwaba College. He was married to the late Josephine Kluttz for 72 years.

Julian began working for Cannon Mills in 1934 and was associated with the company for 45 years having retired in 1979 as Superintendent of Dry Finishing in Kannapolis. He was retained as a consultant for five years.

He has been a committed member of First Presbyterian Church since early childhood having served as Deacon and Elder for many years. His service includes various pulpit and building committees, teaching the Rumble Bible Class and being an active member of the Everyman's Bible Class.

He was active in the community life, serving as chairman of the Salisbury City School Board from 1957 to 1959. He was a former member of the Kawanis Club and a charter member of the Salisbury Historical Foundation.

His hobbies included wood working and golf. He was a master craftsman and

reproduced antiques for his home, family and friends. He was a beloved husband, father, uncle and friend to many and was generous with his time and talents to all he knew.

He is survived by his son, Kerr Julian Krider, Jr. of Decatur, GA, daughter, Jennie Lynn Hatcher (William) of Augusta, GA, grandchildren, Anna Kate Hitchcock (Nathan) of Seattle, WA and John Mark Hatcher (Heidi) of San Diego, CA and seven great grandchildren.
