John Lamberth "J.L." Harvey, Jr., 85 of Salisbury died Sunday, July 5, 2009 at Rowan Regional Medical Center.

Born September 29, 1923 in Danville, VA, he was the son of the late Lucy Durham Harvey and John Lamberth Harvey, Sr. He was educated in the Salisbury schools and graduated from Boyden High School and the Georgia Institute of Technology, Atlanta, GA. He was a veteran of the US Army during World War II.

Mr. Harvey was employed by Western Electric Co., AT&T and Lucent Technology for 31 years before retiring in 1982.

He was a member of Milford Hills United Methodist Church, the United Methodist Men, served on the Board of Trustees and as Chairman of the Finance Committee and was a former Adult Sunday School Superintendent.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brothers, Harry Harvey and Jack Harvey.
