Mrs. LaVerne Cornelison Webb, 86, of Salisbury, NC, died Sunday, February 21, 2010 at her home.

Born November 12, 1923 in Salisbury, NC she was the daughter of the late Mary White Klutz Cornelison and John Currie Cornelison.

Mrs. Webb was a graduate of Spencer High School and Catawba College. She worked as a first grade teacher at Wiley Elementary School where she received the Excellence in Teaching Award.

She was an active member of many organizations including: Epsilon Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society, NEA, NCEA, Milford Hills Lioness Club, Rose Society, Cub Scouts den mother, and was one of the original artists that started the Art Guild, which later became the Waterworks Gallery.
