



Mr Narvie Lee Bonds

September 12, 1930 - October 28, 2015

Narvie Lee Bonds, 85, of Salisbury passed away Wednesday, October 28, 2015 at Novant Health Rowan Medical Center.

Born September 12, 1930 in Rowan County, he was the son of the late Edith Safrit Bonds and Homer Overton Bonds.

He attended Hurley Elementary School and graduated from Mt. Ulla High School. Mr. Bonds served in the US Army during the Korean War and was a Honorably Discharged as a Corporal.

Mr. Bonds was a General Superintendent for Wagoner Construction Company for 36 years and then was owner and served as President of Narvie Bonds Construction for 25 years.

He was a member of the First United Church of Christ where he served as a Deacon, Elder and served as Past President of the Church Council and on multiple church council committees. He was a founding member of Locke Township Fire Department in 1956 and served as Chief for 35 years, from September 1964 – September 1999. A Past President of the West Rowan Boosters Club, Past President of the Rowan Home Builders Association, a long time Rowan County Little League Coach, Past President of the Rowan County Fire and Rescue Association, a member of the Hudson-Miller-Tatum

VFW Post #3006, the Harold B. Jarrett American Legion Post #342 and was a Past Veteran of the Year.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Helen Thompson Bonds on April 27, 2015, sisters, Dot Hansell and Ruby Mae Brown and a granddaughter, Megan Bonds
