Nell Stutts Lyerly, 89, of Salisbury, died Monday, December 13, 2010 in Salisbury.

Born February 13, 1921, in Rowan County, Mrs. Lyerly was the second daughter of the late Elma Leach and Herman Dewey Stutts. She was educated in the Rowan County Schools and was a member of First Baptist Church of Spencer.

Mrs. Lyerly was employed with Woolworth for 44 years and retired as the Manager of the Salisbury store on Main Street.
