Patricia Privett Moore, 83, Co-Owner of The Medicine Shoppe of Salisbury NC passed away after an extended illness on Sunday January 6th, 2019 surrounded by her family and loving husband. She was born to William Henry and Rose Salamone Privett on April 30th, 1935 in East Port, Long Island, NY. Patricia earned her associate degree of nursing from Farleigh Dickinson, NJ, her Bachelor of Science Nursing degree from Columbia, NY and became a Certified Registered Nurse Infusion (CRNI) Nurse. In February she would have celebrated 62 beautiful years of marriage to Banks McIlvain (Thomas) Moore III.
