Mr. Phillip (Phil) C. Harbinson, 75, of Salisbury, NC passed away Saturday, October 5 at Genesis Healthcare.

Phil was born November 22, 1943 to the late Rev. Cline Harbinson and Mrs. Madeline Campbell Harbinson. Phil was a member of Mount Tabor United Methodist Church in Salisbury. Being a lifelong Miami Dolphins and LA Dodgers fan, he was accustomed to having a broken heart when it comes to sports. That turned around when he became a coach for East Rowan High School. Being head baseball coach from 1968-1985, Phil had 256 wins and 60 losses, with not a single loss at a home game. He also led his teams to 3 state championship wins. Phil was a loving husband, father, grandfather, brother, friend, and coach. Because Phil despised fruits, vegetables, chicken, and anything remotely healthy, it was a shock to the family that the dementia was what took him from them.

In addition to his parents, Phil is preceded in death by his son Josh P Harbinson & his Lily-dog.

Survivors include: his wife of 44 years, Angie Henderson Harbinson, son Joe Harbinson (fiancé Jamie) of Salisbury, MD and their children Jacob, Jamison, & Jenna, son Jonathan Harbinson (wife Amanda) of Salisbury, NC and their children Cole, Bryce, & Adyson. Along with his brothers Joel Harbinson of Hickory, Mark Harbinson of Taylorsville; sister, Dr. Jane Teague of Taylorsville & his nephews.
