Ranne' Michelle Sioux, age 95, of Salisbury passed away Thursday, June 11, 2015 at the Laurels of Salisbury.

Ms. Sioux was born February 21, 1920 in Roland, IA the daughter of the late Dr. John Allan Snyder and Annie Adeline Shedd Snyder. She was educated in Roland, IA, Hornick, IA, Anadarko, OK and Davenport, IA schools and graduated from Marycrest College for Women in Davenport, IA, she received a Bachelor degree in Education and Supervision from Roosevelt University in Chicago, IL. Ranne' attended Goodman Theater in Chicago, IL for 2 years and became an actor and director.

A Recreational Therapist, she was employed at the VA Hospital in Chicago, IL, was Chief of the Recreation Therapist Section of the VA Hospital, Chillicothe, OH and was Chief of Recreation Services at the W.G. Hefner VA Medical Center in Salisbury. She was employed by the VA Hospitals for 28 years before retiring in 1984.

She was a member of the Catholic Daughters and was of the Roman Catholic faith. Ms. Ranne' was a Veteran of the US Marine Corps during WWII, member of the Harold B. Jarrett American Legion Post #342, former member of Amvets Post 565, American Association of University Women, Altrusa Club, D.A.R. Montezuma, IA chapter, National Association of Retired Federal

Employees, Rowan Literacy Council, Chicago Art Institute and MADD of Rowan County.

Preceding her in death was her brother John Shedd Snyder and sister Susan Snyder Johnson.
