Mr. Richard Dean Schnably, 84, of Advance, NC passed away Friday, May 29, 2015 at the WG Hefner VA Medical Center State Veterans Home in Salisbury, NC.

Born February 11, 1931 in Bedford, PA he was the son of the late Allene Virginia Hazelette and Richard D. Schnably.

Mr. Schnably was a graduate of Kenwood High School in Essex, MD. He joined the US Navy in 1948, serving in Malta patrolling for submarines. After his service, Mr. Schnably worked for Martin Marietta and Amp Incorporated, starting as a salesman and working his way to district sales manager of the southeast until his retirement.

He was a member of First Baptist Church in Winston Salem and the Shrine Club in Maryland. In 2001 he was awarded the Citizen of the Year award in in Beverly Hills, FL.

Preceding him in death along with his parents are son, Richard Lynn Schnably.
