



Mr. Rino Anthony Quattrin

June 13, 1930 - April 17, 2015

Rino Anthony Quattrin, age 84, of Salisbury passed away Friday, April 17, at Novant Health Rowan Medical Center.

Mr. Quattrin was born June 13, 1930 in Cordenons in Northern Italy, the son of the late Anna Russolo Quattrin and Antonio Quattrin.

Rino was a pitcher for a farm team of the NY Yankees from 1949-1951 where he held the minor league record for most pick offs in one season at 32. After serving in the US Army from 1952-1954, he began umpiring. He umpired for many years, from minor league baseball all the way down to high school baseball. Rino umpired many American Legion games including 3 American Legion World Series games. After umpiring he became owner/operator of The Trophy Center in Salisbury.


Those left to cherish his memories are his wife JoAnn Casper Quattrin whom he married September 10, 1972; step-sons Darrell Casper and wife Chris and Jerry (Petie) Boulware and wife Tammy of Salisbury; grand- daughter Shannon Casper of Salisbury; great-granddaughters Bella and Daisy.
