“ I wanted to share at the service, but I just couldn't add anything to what Dianna said. But one of my favorite memories of Lee was that he and Caleb (who was all of four or five then) came out to the house when Eli disappeared one day. He was all of two. Emma was newborn, and I was nursing her, when the children all came in from outside to get ready for naps. The house was unusually quiet. So I asked, is everyone in? Where is Eli? And I got a moment of silence, and a "just a minute" from Jon. Who was all of 12 then! So I finished nursing Emma, put her in her crib, and went out to discover that they had left the back door open. And Eli had utterly disappeared! How terrifying. We lived in the country. There were fields of weeds higher than his little head, bodies of water too deep to be safe, cows in a pasture surrounded by an electric fence, and drop offs where trash was dumped! OY! Of course 911 was called and a search began immediately.

Lee showed up prayed with us, Caleb kept David (who was 4) entertained, and they stayed until we found the little rascal. I remembered when we prayed, that I asked God to just stick him down someplace safe until we could find him. About ten minutes later a neighbor from up the road came down to check on Mister Cress, our older neighbor, thinking maybe something had happened. When she found out what was going on she said that as she was walking down to check on Mr. Cress she heard a strange sound, sort of like a bob-cat! lol We went where she heard it, and there was Eli, howling like something wild, saying "TUCK!!!! I TUCK!!!" He had gotten into the mud where the cows trample down to the stream, and the mud had gotten to the texture that was unnavigable!

Mrs. Cress had gotten to where he was first, and had climbed down to him, because he knew her better than the firemen. Lee climbed down with her to help her get him back out. After we got him, hugged him, and rejoiced a minute, there was a bit of silence, and then Lee said, "Wow Mama Duncan, God stuck him down just like you asked! The next time I need specific prayer I know just who I

*am going to call! " And we all had a good laugh of relief and went home! That turned out to be a good day. But Lee and Caleb's presence made it so much better. <3*

I knew he was a caring man. He always put his family first, another valuable lesson rarely learned. He didn't exhaust his time off for frivolous activities, but only to care for his family, always by their side. He was a thoughtful man with actions carefully and thoughtfully examined. He rarely gave a quick answer, but would take time to make wise decisions. Sometimes long after questions had been asked, but he always responded with wise words.  
It is hard to hold the title of Building inspector, perform the job, even when tough decisions must be made, and make a friend. Lee did this over and over again. It always amazed me while helping in his area the things people would say about him. Even when he became sick I received phone calls from concerned folks.  
Lastly Lee never ended a conversation in the typical way most do with bye, good-bye, see you later, etc. This was always awkward for me but It's not until now that I think I know why. The purpose of these gestures is to end a conversation. This was just another way of pronouncing his faith in Jesus and that though him there is no end but life everlasting.  
Like many before him Lee left behind some big shoes to fill.  
I pray these words will help ease your sorrow and bring a positive light to your day.
