Bob received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Mathematics from the University of Virginia in Charlottesville in 1980. He was employed as a software engineer with Digital Equipment Corporation in Newark, Delaware and Charlotte, NC. He later started his own software company, MicroHUNT Consulting Associates in Rock Hill, SC. Bob was an avid sports enthusiast and loved his Panthers, Phillies, Eagles and all the sports teams at UVA. He was also a gifted writer and kept hundreds entertained with his weekly Monday Morning Noter.

Bob was preceded in death by his parents, Robert Emmett Hunt, Sr and Elizabeth Ann (McGuire) Hunt. He is survived by his former wife, Cindy Taubenkimel, and their three daughters, Sara Beth, Becky and Ally, his three siblings, Karyn, Joseph and Patricia, his four nieces, Emily, Julee, Lydia and Chelsee, his nephew Garrett and his four granddaughters.
