Stanley M. Zedalis, 88, a former professional baseball player and gentleman carpenter passed away on October 6, 2013, in Pahoehoe, Hawaii. His wife of 64 years, Martha B. Zedalis, 84, had passed away on May 11, 2012, in San Marcos, California. The couple raised nine children and held former homes in Orlando, Florida; Rialto, California; Minden, Nevada; Honouliuli, Hawaii; and San Marcos, California.

Stanley was born in Freeland, Pennsylvania. He is a veteran of WWII having served in the US Navy aboard the naval refueling tanker - USS Niobrara. After WWII, he returned to Pennsylvania and played semi-pro baseball for the Anthracite League, pitching for both the Eckley Reds and Hazleton Orioles. He later signed for the Washington Senators, and played in their minor league – the Orlando Senators - based in Florida. He then moved to California with his wife and family and worked as a carpenter until his retirement.

Martha was born in Orlando, Florida. She is a descendent of Revolutionary War veteran William Jackson Hull. She was a wife, mother, homemaker, and was retired from the San Bernardino California Sheriff's Department.

Stanley and Martha Zedalis were married for 64 years. Stanley is survived by his brother Michael Zedalis of Cumberland, New Jersey. Stanley and Martha are survived by their nine children: Rex Zedalis, Lillian Zedalis, William
