Mr. Thomas "Lee" Coble, 87, of Salisbury, passed away Saturday, March 13, 2010 at his residence.

Born November 19, 1922 in Davie County, he was the son of the late Jesse L. Coble and Rosa Belle Broadway Coble. He was educated in the Davie County Schools.

Mr. Coble served in the US Army from 1950-1953. He then worked as a textile operator at Cone Mills and then retired from Celanese Fiber in 1985.
