Thomas Lee "Bud" Sprinkle, 92, passed away at Autumn Care of Salisbury, January 5, 2012.

Born Jan 14, 1919 in Salisbury, he was the son of the late John Thomas and Berta Taylor Sprinkle.

He attended Salisbury City Schools and graduated from Boyden High School, Class of 1936.

Mr. Sprinkle was a veteran of the US Navy during World War II and served on the USS Delta.

He worked for Southern Railway for 33 years as a boilermaker before retiring on January 2, 1979.

Bud was a member of the First Baptist Church of Salisbury, was a Charter Member of the TarHeel Racing Pigeon Club formed in April 1959 and he flew representing the C&S Loft, the Harold B. Jarrett American Legion Post #342 for 64 years, Fulton Masonic Lodge #99 A.F. & A.M.
