Mr. Thurman Franklin Miller, 90, of Woodleaf, NC, who loved to travel, made his final journey Saturday, September 16, 2017 at Novant Health Rowan Medical Center.

He was born September 19, 1926 in Davie County, NC to Frank B. Miller and Kathryn "Kate" Penninger Miller. Mr. Miller graduated from Cooleemee High School and served in the Marine Corp during the WWII era, primarily as a projectionist. On December 24, 1946 he married Irene Barbee Miller, who passed away November 12, 2012. They had four children: Annette Miller of Salisbury, NC and Barbara Thomas of Pleasant Garden, NC; William "Bill" Miller and Sandra Thomas who predeceased Mr. Miller. He is also survived by ten grandchildren, sixteen great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild. A brother, Guilford Miller also preceded him in death.

Mr. Miller was a long-time member of The Arbor United Methodist Church. He loved traveling, reading and particularly having cigarettes and coffee while exchanging tales with friends at Cooleemee Drug Store.
