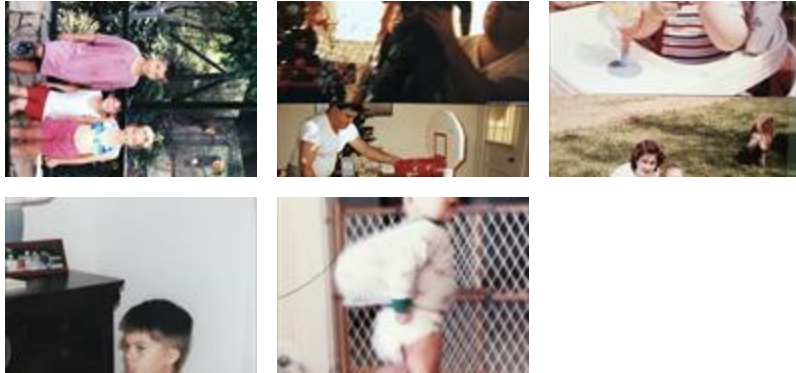

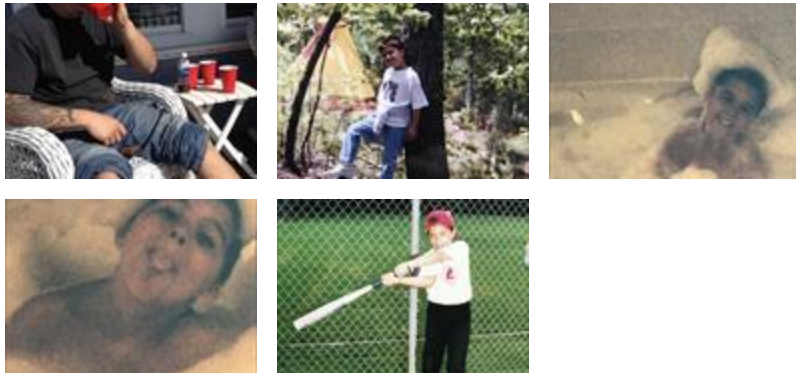

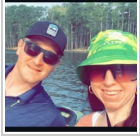

“ I loved Trev from the moment I set eyes on him. The first night home from the hospital he politely peed on me, and peed, and peed and peed. No matter how many times his mom told that story, Trev loved to hear it. He got the same twinkle in his eye and that smirk on his face. It was the first lesson that Trev taught me that helped me when we had 4 boys of our own. Trev was like a son to Mark and me. He set the bar high for what we were hoping we would have in our own children. He was a great baby, toddler, tyke, teen, and then young man. He was a role model to all his cousins by being present, by showing real interest in their lives, for hugging them, telling them he loved them, teasing them, sharing his humor and life experiences with them. It's tough to accept that the memories made with Trev are completed as of June 19, 2019. A parent, a mother should never have to say a permanent goodbye to their child. That will never make sense to me.

There may not really be perfection, or a person that is perfect, but Trev was perfect to me. He checked all the boxes for someone that was full of heart and wanted to do the things that led to a happy future. This past year, he talked many times about getting married and having a "family of his own." He talked about becoming an uncle and getting closer to 30 years old. He was wanting to make sure I was going to be okay with our first born being done with high school. He was laughing at me and helping me to put things into perspective. He was reassuring me that his cousin was going to be more than fine. He said he was excited for Austin and was excited for his other cousin, Ferg when it came to the college stuff. He was excited to share in Seth's bachelor party and wedding. He felt bad to not be able to make our son's graduation party due to a conflict. He apologized 3 times about it, which shows how important sharing in family moments was to him. He loved his job at Freightliner and his new schedule.

I see Trev in our oldest son who does a great impression of Trev's laugh. This same son does the Trev eyebrow raise which has melted my heart and always made me say, "OMG you look just like Trev when you do that." I am hoping at some point to find comfort again in seeing Trev mannerisms in one of our kids. I keep reading

the texts and playing the phone call conversations back in my head. I can vividly recall the times he has been in our house, the conversations, the look on his face, and his laugh.

I've NEVER liked being called ma'am by anyone other than Trev.

There was just something about the way he said it that was endearing. Trev was not always the guy with a lot of words. He could say his opinion or give a look that made you know how he felt about something. He was the king of one-liners and could ALWAYS make me laugh or make me see that things were not as dramatic as they appeared. He was respectful of Mark, me, and our boys.

There is no way to prepare or even comprehend a loss like this.

This will never be ok, and I will never be able to make sense of this.

NEVER! There is only one Trev. I thank my lucky stars that I was lucky enough to marry into the family that included Trev. I am better for the 28 years I have had the honor of sharing with him. To say I will miss Trev is an understatement. The world without Trev leaves me devastated, but I would not give up the time I've had with him for anything. I am better, our family unit is better, because Trev was a part of it. His Granny thought he hung the moon and I can tell you that Trev hung that same moon for me!

We are sad, numb, and shaking our heads like the rest of you. So, on behalf of my family I am thankful for all the people that have known Trev and positively influenced the wonderful son, brother, cousin, friend, family member, coworker, and man he had grown into.

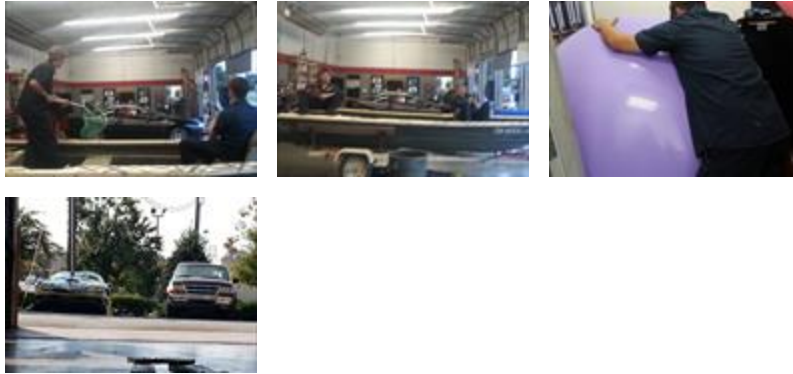
