



Cmdr. William Jerry Brown

October 13, 1937 - May 27, 2024

Cmdr. William Jerry Brown, 86, of Salisbury, NC passed away Monday, May 27, 2024 at his residence.

Cmdr. Brown was born October 13, 1937 to the late William Council Brown and Mary Wagoner Brown in Salisbury, NC. He was a graduate of Boyden High School, Class of 1956; Catawba College, and UNC Chapel Hill Graduate School. At Boyden High in 1954, he started the Boyden Tennis team which has continued to this day. He played #1 and #2 on the team for 3 years. He was a veteran of the N.C. Army National Guard (30th Division), the U.S. Army (4th Corps), and the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps where he retired as full Commander. He worked as Assistant Director, Chief Bacteriologist-Parasitologist of the West Palm Beach Laboratory, Florida State Board of Health. He served as a research microbiologist at the CDC (Center for Disease Control) in Atlanta where he had many research publications in national and international medical journals including JAMA (Journal of the American Medical Association).

Cmdr. Brown enjoyed tennis for 50 years and had his own tennis tournament at the CDC in Atlanta. His home was open to many stray cats which were fixed and had long healthy lives. His favorite was little Moishe (named for Ann Frank's cat) because he appeared on Hanukkah one year.

He was preceded in death by his parents and sister Mary Louise Rice.

He is survived by a niece, Dianne Rice Lamb of Pennsylvania and several great nieces and nephews.

A graveside service will be held Saturday, June 8, 2024 at 2 PM at City Memorial Park, officiated by Rev. Steve Holshouser.

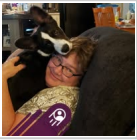

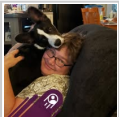
What did he die of? What has happened to his beloved collection of war items? We were never informed of his passing....we are family.
